With generous donations from the Friends, the NES Library has received copies of picture books nominated for New Hampshire's 2025 Ladybug Picture Book Award. Students in grades K-3 read the nominated books with Mrs. Lieberman, school librarian. In December, each student votes for one of the nominated titles to win the award; their votes are counted with votes cast by students all over NH. Last year's Ladybug Award winner was *100 Mighty Dragons All Named Broccoli* by David LaRochele.

The Friends of the Library also donated multiple copies of novels nominated for the 2025-26 Great Stone Face Award, New Hampshire's student choice book award given by students in fourth through sixth grades. These multiple copies allow several students to read these books at once, since they are longer chapter books. Students vote for their favorite novel in April. Sunday, February 1 from 4:00 - 6:00 pm at Town Hall Hosted by Raise the Bar Trivia

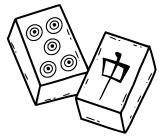

Patrons can borrow the Library monitor to screen for radon levels in their home. Tax Bills and Voter Registrations

NH Division of Motor Vehicles

All NH Division of Motor Vehicle Offices across New Hampshire have moved to a fully appointment-based system to transact all customer business, from obtaining a driver license to registering a vehicle. Property Tax Bills

The 2025 December property tax bills will be due in mid to late December because there has been a delay in setting our tax rate with the NH Department of Revenue. An email will be sent out to Newfields residents when the property tax bills have been mailed.
